### What's new at the library

### **Good things**

Our growing Library of Things makes it easy to explore a new hobby, experience nature, play a game, do-it-yourself, investigate new technology, and so much more. With dozens of "things" to check out, you may be wondering where to begin. You can start by asking yourself what it is you'd like to learn or try or do.

**DO YOU WANT TO EXPLORE YOUR MUSICAL SIDE?** Brand new to our collection is a group of digital sound mixing tools, including a synthesizer, bass machine, sampler, drum machine and more. We've also got bongos, electronic drum kits, keyboards, ukuleles and xylophones.

**ARE YOU LOOKING TO BE HANDY AROUND THE HOUSE?** Borrow one of our household tools, such as a laser level or home inspection kit. We've even got diagnostic code readers for your car and a Kill A Watt meter that can help you identify ways to reduce your energy bill.

**ARE YOU UP FOR SOME ENTERTAINMENT?** Check out a karaoke machine or a digital projector and Bluetooth speaker and host an evening in with friends. Try out an e-reader. You can also borrow a virtual reality headset or a Nintendo Switch and the games to go with it. We've got lawn games, too, for some outdoor fun when the weather warms.

**DO YOU NEED TO CONNECT TO THE INTERNET?** We can help. We loan Wi-Fi hotspots, Chromebooks and solar chargers.

### WOULD YOU LIKE TO DIGITALLY CAPTURE AND PRESERVE YOUR

**MEMORIES?** Our Library of Things includes GoPro cameras, digital camcorders, film and slide scanners, as well as analog video and cassette converters.

**HOW ABOUT SOMETHING FOR THE KIDS?** They can borrow everything from Ozobots to American Girl dolls, along with juggling sets, a human anatomy model and bird- or bug-watching kits.

**ARE YOU INTERESTED IN EXPLORING THE GREAT OUTDOORS?** We've got a motion-activated trail camera that will capture the hidden lives of the critters in or near your backyard. We also loan out binoculars, telescopes, metal detectors, fishing poles and Empire passes for New York State parks.

All Library of Things items are purchased with support from the Friends of Bethlehem Public Library and are available on a first-come basis to library cardholders. Loan times vary by item. To see what's available, visit www.bethlehempubliclibrary.org/borrow/library-of-things.

### Tech help at the library

If you would like to raise your comfort level with technology or software that is new to you, the library offers one-on-one tech help by appointment. During the session, a librarian will show you the ins and outs of your smart phone, tablet or e-reader. You can also learn how to set up and manage an email account, get started on Microsoft Word, or navigate Facebook and Twitter. Sign up for a one-hour appointment at least one week in advance by visiting the Information Desk or calling 518-439-9314, ext. 3009.

In addition to one-on-one help sessions, the library frequently schedules courses that offer small-group lessons in computer basics. Coming up in February we've got an Introduction to Windows 10 class and Intro to the Internet, both for beginners. (See Page 5 for details.)

### A storytelling event for all


### Rubber Ducky, you're the one!

The library is putting the finishing touches on a new and improved audio/ visual Makerspace. The space, located inside the parking lot entrance has been painted and redesigned to be ADA compliant and user-friendly.

The biggest news is the debut of the One Button Studio, which makes recording video as easy as pushing a button. The One Button Studio concept, developed by Penn State, can be used to produce content for the library's public access TV station, BCN-TV, or for sharing on YouTube or any other digital medium. Students can also use the technology to practice and record interviews or school projects. We'll also have the latest equipment and software available for video editing, podcasting, Twitch streaming and more. Stay tuned!
