- The varied lineup for Coffee and Conversation, co-sponsored by Bethlehem Senior Projects, Inc., touched on music, history, travel and more.
- Extensive outreach brought us into the community and our schools.
- Our website and Footnotes newsletter were redesigned to make them more user-friendly.
- In the fall, we partnered with local fire departments and surrounding libraries to offer a special fire safety storytime.
- We hosted an indoor miniature golf* event that was free and open to the entire community.
- We added portable Wi-Fi, hotspots, laptops, telescopes, Ozobots, metal detectors, virtual reality visors and karoake machines to our special collections shelf, or "library of things," which is underwritten by the Friends.
- Summer Reading was a huge hit. Teen volunteers kept everything running smoothly, and adults were encouraged to take part with their very own Bingo reading challenge.
- Both of our longstanding concert series, Evenings on the Green* (summer) and A Little Sunday Music* (winter), draw large audiences each year. An ice cream social* during one of the summer performances is a huge hit with the community.
- We continue to open up our meeting rooms for group study before the January and June Regents exams, adding study break activities on some of the days.
- Monthly Listening Parties allow music lovers to explore their favorite artists in depth.
- Richie Phillips, local radio personality, brought his kid-friendly songwriting program to the library.
- Author Ann Leary stopped by to discuss her craft.
- Several programs were done in partnership with Five Rivers some at the library and some at the nature center.




