The library is scheduled to begin charging fines for overdue items

returned after Dec. 31, 2020. At the beginning of the pandemic, we waived fines until there was a safe and reliable way to return materials. These days, we are able to accept most returns 24/7, with a "reverse curbside pickup" for Library of Things items. Automatic due date reminders are going out, and quarantine procedures are being rigorously followed.

• Because of the mandatory four-day quarantine, items returned will not show up on your account right away. Don't worry, we will be taking that lag time into account so you will not be charged for the time your items spend in quarantine.

• Remember to always renew or return your items by the due date to avoid late charges.

• Fees for lost or damaged items are not being waived.
