Bethlehem Public Library is a member of the Upper Hudson Library System (UHLS), a consortium of 29 public libraries in Albany and Rensselaer counties. Access to all UHLS collections is provided through our catalog.

You may borrow materials from any UHLS library with your Bethlehem Public Library card. Borrowing policies of the lending library apply.

Most UHLS cards are accepted at Bethlehem Public Library.

# BORROWING POLICIES

## Bethlehem Public Library cards

- Issued to Bethlehem Central School District residents or those who work or go to school here.
- A picture ID and proof of current residence required.

## Upper Hudson Library System cards

- Issued to patrons residing outside Bethlehem Central School District but inside Albany and Rensselaer counties.

## LOAN PERIODS

- 3 to 28 days
- 2 renewals on most materials not requested by other patrons

## FINES PER DAY

- Books, audio books, music CDs, DVDs . . . . . **10 cents**
- Video games, e-readers and Library of Things . . . . . **\$1**
- Museum passes (3-day loan) . . . . **\$5**
- Interlibrary loan . . . . . **\$1**
- Downloadable eBooks, eAudio, and eMagazines . . . . . **no fines**
- WiFi hotspots, Chromebooks . . . . **\$5**

Maximum fine per item . . . . . **\$5**

Patrons owing \$5 or more in fines lose borrowing privileges.

Borrowers pay replacement cost for materials lost or irreparably damaged while on loan.
