Volunteering at the library

Volunteers are an important part of our library family and have helped with everything from Braille labeling to local history digitization. Our teen volunteers can earn important service credits by helping out during summer programs and other library activities.

New curbside hours

With the shorter days and unpredictable weather, we have made some small changes to our curbside service for staff and patron safety. Curbside pickup is now available Monday-Friday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturday-Sunday from 1-4:30 p.m. We've also reduced the number of drive-up spaces as more and more people opt to use our in-person service, and we've moved our walk-up pickup point closer to our garage access to take advantage of the lighting and sheltered space.

Curbside pickup, which was launched in 2020 as a pandemic necessity, has remained popular even as in-person restrictions have eased. We continue to fine-tune this service, but rest assured it remains a core part of what we do.

DO YOU WANT TO EXPLORE YOUR MUSICAL SIDE? Brand new to our collection is a group of digital sound mixing tools, including a synthesizer, bass machine, sampler, drum machine and more. We've also got bongos, electronic drum kits, keyboards, ukuleles and xylophones.

ARE YOU LOOKING TO BE HANDY AROUND THE HOUSE? Borrow one of our household tools, such as a laser level or home inspection kit. We've even got diagnostic code readers for your car and a Kill A Watt meter that can help you identify ways to reduce your energy bill.




