Get growing with seed library

Our seed library returns this spring with a variety of open-pollinated vegetables, herbs and some flowers. Bethlehem cardholders can choose up to 10 seed packets per household using our online "shopping" portal from March 13-April 10, where you'll be able to browse the different categories and learn more about the varieties of seeds available. During this time, walk-in requests cannot be filled. Visit www.bethlehempubliclibrary.org to get started ordering your seeds online. We'll be in touch with you when they are ready to be picked up curbside or at the checkout desk.

Beginning **April 11**, seed packets can be selected in-person at the Information Desk while supplies last.

Seed libraries like ours support sustainability and food security by allowing the community free access to the means of growing their own food.

Trustee candidate info available

Nominating petition forms and informational packets are available at the library or digitally by e-mailing **information@bethpl.org** for candidates interested in serving on the Bethlehem Public Library Board of Trustees. There are two seats on the 2023 ballot, currently held by incumbents Mark Kissinger and Caroline Brancatella, who are both be seeking re-election.

Petitions will need at least 94 signatures of voters residing in the Bethlehem Central School District. Petitions must be filed with the District Clerk, Bethlehem Central High School, 700 Delaware Ave., Delmar by **5pm on April 17**. The election will be held **Tuesday May 16**.

Be part of the conversation

As part of our long-range goals, library staff and trustees are looking at ways to make our 50-year-old building more responsive to the needs of today's community. Some of the updates we're considering include an entrance more accessible to the parking lot, ample space for public and library programs, and a permanent curbside pick-up and drop-off window – all concepts based on comments we have heard time and again from library users.

The Board of Trustees has contracted with architects at Ashley McGraw to come up with some design solutions to address these and other issues. You can watch their public presentations on our YouTube channel.



For this relatively modest body of work she was awarded, among other honors, the Pulitzer Prize, the National Book Award, and the Books Abroad/ Neustadt International Prize for Literature. At the same time, her work is surprisingly accessible and a delight to read out loud.




